and other random effects could be 4 percentage points in either direction.

The international samples range in size from 658 interviews (in Spain) to 2,373 (in Mexico), with an average of 1,253 interviews per country. The surveys were conducted in June, July and August by affiliates of Gallup International Research Institute (GIRI).

In addition to sampling error, question wording and practical difficulties in conducting surveys can introduce error or bias into the findings of opinion polls. This report conforms to the standards of disclosure of the National Council on Public Polls.
